Internal Review and Recommendations

Per 40 CFR § 122.33, and PA Title 25 § 92a.3, Wyomissing Borough (the applicant) is required to seek coverage under a NPDES permit issued by the state of Pennsylvania. Due to a TMDL and Special Protection waters, the applicant has submitted an application for renewal of coverage under an individual permit.

The applicant discharges to the following receiving waters: Wyomissing Creek, Tulpehocken Creek, and the Schuylkill River.

According to the MS4 Requirements Table, the applicant is subject to the following IP appendix requirements:

- Appendix B for Cacoosing Creek impairment
- Appendix C for the Schuylkill River PCB impairment/TMDL
- Appendix E for Cacoosing Creek and Tulpehocken Creek impairment
- Appendix F for the Wyomissing Creek impairment/TMDL

To comply with Appendix E the applicant has submitted Pollutant Reduction Plan (PRP) for Cacoosing and Tulpehocken Creeks.

To comply with Appendix F the applicant has submitted a Total Maximum Daily Load Plan (TMDL Plan), which is joint plan with the other MS4 permittees that discharge to Wyomissing Creek.

There are no unresolved violations associated with the applicant that would affect issuance of coverage.

It is recommended that individual permit coverage is granted in accordance with 40 CFR §123.35.

Internal Review and Recommendations

Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
