Purpose of Application Renewal of NPDES permit for discharge of industrial stormwater.					
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Summary of Review

The applicant is requesting a renewal of their NPDES permit to discharge stormwater associated with industrial activity to Iron Run, a HQ-CWF, MF (High Quality-Cold Water Fishes, Migratory Fishes) designated receiving stream in state water plan basin 2-C (Lower Lehigh River). As per the Department's current existing use list, the receiving stream segment does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than its designated use. This stream segment is designated as a naturally reproducing trout stream as per PA Fish & Boat Commission.

American Craft Brewery LLC produces beer, non-traditional beer product (consisting of hard teas, hard seltzers, etc.), and hard cider at this location. The Brewery has been operated by American Craft Brewery (ACB), previously referred to as Samuel Adams Pennsylvania Brewery Company, since June 2008.

The facility is categorized by SIC code 2082 (Manufacturing – Malt Beverages) and falls under Appendix I monitoring requirements of the PAG-03 General Permit. Semi-annual monitoring and reporting for pH, 5-Day Biochemical Oxygen Demand, Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD), Nitrate + Nitrite Nitrogen, and Oil & Grease are required under the PAG-03.

Benchmark values exist for TSS, COD, and Oil & Grease. A benchmark value is the concentration of a pollutant in stormwater discharges that serves as a threshold for the determination of whether existing site BMPs are effective in controlling stormwater pollution. The benchmark values can be found in Part C. V. F. of the permit. A corrective action plan must be submitted to DEP if the discharge concentration for the parameters exceed the benchmark values for two or more consecutive monitoring periods.

PPC Plan implementation and completion of an annual inspection and compliance evaluation are required under the permit.

A Water Management System Inspection guery indicated that on June 23, 2020 a Compliance Evaluation was performed.

Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
