**Summary of Review**

The applicant is requesting renewal of an NPDES permit to discharge stormwater associated with an industrial activity to an unnamed tributary to Shehawken Creek, a ~~High Quality - C~~ ~~cold water fishery~~ ~~Fishes, Migratory Fish (HQ-CWF, MF)~~-designated receiving stream ~~(HQ-CWF, MF)~~ in State Water Plan Basin 01-A. Per the Department's current existing use list, the receiving stream does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than the designated use.

The facility is classified under SIC Code 3273 – Manufacturing – Ready-Mixed Concrete and fall under **Appendix N** Monitoring requirement of PAG-03 general permit and monitoring requirements for this industrial stormwater classification. Monitoring/reporting exist for pH (S.U.), Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Total Nitrogen, Total Phosphorus, Total Aluminum and Total Iron. Benchmarks exist for TSS and pH.

~~Benchmark values are not effluent limitations, and exceedances do not constitute permit violations. However, if the permittee's sampling demonstrates exceedances of benchmark values for two or more consecutive monitoring periods, the permittee shall take action in accordance with~~ A benchmark value is the concentration of a pollutant in stormwater discharges that serves as a threshold for the determination of whether existing site BMPs are effective in controlling stormwater pollution. ~~The benchmark values can be found in~~ Part C. V. F. of the permit. A corrective action plan must be submitted to DEP if the discharge concentration for the parameters exceed the benchmark values for two or more consecutive monitoring periods.

Previous limit for TSS and pH were removed in this permit term ~~since benchmarks cannot be coded as permit limit anymore~~ due to changes in the General Permit.

A Unified Contingency Plan, Spill ~~P~~revention & Countermeasure and PPC plan (updated 2024) was submitted with ~~the~~ application.

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
