**Summary of Review**

The applicant is requesting renewal of their NPDES permit to discharge stormwater associated with industrial activity to Little Bushkill Creek, a HQ-CWF, MF (High Quality-Cold Water Fishes, Migratory Fishes) designated receiving stream in state water plan basin 1-F (Jacoby – Bushkill Creeks). As per the Department's current existing use list, the receiving stream does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than its designated use.

The permit application indicates the facility is categorized by SIC code 5015 (Wholesale Trade – Motor Vehicle Parts, Used). The Pollution Prevention Plan that was provided with the application indicates the facility is also categorized by SIC code 5093 (Whole Trade – Scrap & Waste Materials). The facility falls under Appendix O and P monitoring requirements of the PAG-03 General Permit.

Appendix O of the latest PAG-03 General Permit includes benchmark values for Total Suspended Solids (TSS) and Oil & Grease. Appendix P of the latest PAG-03 General Permit also includes benchmark values for Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD). All industries classified under Appendices O and P should be within the following values: 120 mg/L for COD, 100 mg/L for TSS, and 30 mg/L for Oil & Grease. The values are included as IMAX limitations and should be sampled semi-annually. Appendix P also requires semi-annual monitoring and reporting for Total Copper, Total Lead, and Total Zinc under this permit. Appendix O requires semi-annual monitoring and reporting for Total Iron and Total Aluminum under this permit. Monitoring and reporting requirements for Total Kjeldahl Nitrogen has been removed from the permit as per updated requirements under Appendices O and P.

PPC Plan implementation and completion of an annual inspection and compliance evaluation are required under the permit.

A Water Management System Inspection query indicated on February 9, 2018 a Compliance Evaluation was performed.

The previously issued permit expired on September 30, 2020 and the renewal application was received on May 8, 2020.

Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
